

A guide to your inorganic service

We collect inorganic items from **inside your property boundary**, not the berm or the roadside. We save anything we can repair, repurpose or reuse.



How to book - collection dates will display only if bookings are still open for your area.

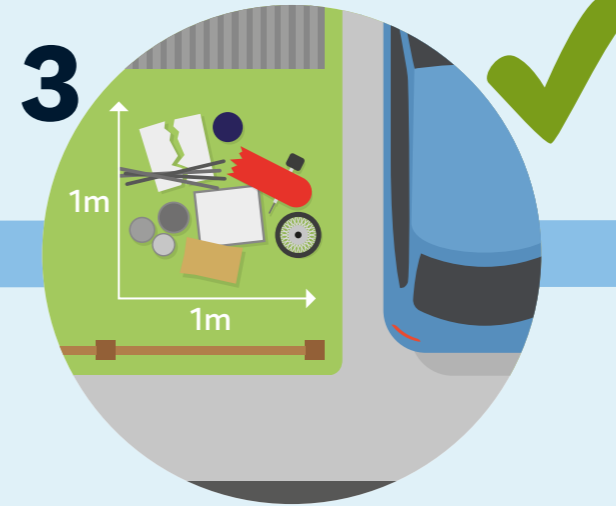
- **Online** - visit aucklandcouncil.govt.nz/Inorganic
- **In person** - visit one of our local libraries

You can book your collection anytime from mid-June to eight days before your scheduled collection week.



Process

Once you have made a booking, we will immediately confirm your collection week. Then a few days before the collection week we will advise you by email, text or phone what day we will pick up your inorganic waste.



On collection day

Inorganic collections take place between 7am and 4pm. Put items **inside** your property/section boundary at the front and as close as possible to the driveway / entrance. Each property can place out up to 1m³ of inorganic material. If you place more than this out for collection it will be left behind.



Do not put them on the berm, kerb or footpath - this is considered illegal dumping.



What happens

Inorganic materials are collected by two trucks. One truck will pick up reusable inorganic material, and the other truck will take other accepted items.



What we will do

Council will give reusable or repairable items to local groups to fix, rehome or resell.

Large appliances
Items like fridges, freezers, washing machines and ovens.



Furniture
Items like beds, chairs, kitchen items and ornaments.



Sporting
Items like gym equipment, bicycles and toys.



Renovation
Items like tools, fixtures and fittings, baths and sinks.



Outdoors
Items like lawnmowers, BBQs, garden tools and outdoor furniture.



Electronics
Items like TVs, computers, phones and DVD players.



Small appliances
Items like kettles, irons and vacuum cleaners.

We won't take:



Household rubbish



Recyclable packaging



Garden waste
Items like grass clippings, tree and hedge trimmings.



Automotive and Boating parts
Items like tyres and car parts.



Building and trade waste
Items like plaster board, rubble and bricks.



Liquids
Items like oil, petrol, paint and chemicals.



Hazardous
Items like broken glass, poisons, batteries and medical waste.



Asbestos
Items like Fibrolite, floor coverings, lagging and ceiling coatings.



Gas cylinders
Items like CNG and LPG containers.



Porcelain and ceramic



Polystyrene
Items like polystyrene from bean bags, packaging and ridged plastics



Concrete and concrete-containing items

Check the Worksafe website for certified asbestos removers. Household rubbish and recycling should be put out in your usual kerbside collection.
